Let's look at the numbers, both scores and money won.

An analysis shows that 15 out of the 35 players won money on Oct. 3 (not counting our usual low net, skins and birdies). Donnie Bradham, Scott Fritts and Mike Linares all won a total of \$200 each. Dan VanWert took in \$160 total. Matt Schapman won \$140. Ron Boone and Darren Howard both won \$100. Hershel Krigbaum and Alexis Cliburn both won \$80. And finally, Dominic De La Garza, Ron Harris, Gary Crenshaw, John Butler, Josh Howard and Ronny Copeland all won \$60, for a grand total of \$1,620!

How did we score? The average net score for A Flight was 81.4. It was 89.3 for B Flight and 92.4 for C Flight, a difference of only 11 strokes from A to C Flights. There were less than 8 strokes difference between A and B

Flights, and only 3.1 between B and C Flights.

How did we do it? Here is the breakdown: all together, we slashed, hacked, stroked and putted our way around The Hawk Golf Course in 3,066 strokes! That's an average gross score of 87.6. We chipped, slopped, hooked and sliced our way to a total of 2,545 net strokes, which averaged out to 72.7, nearly at even par. There were five gross scores in the 70s, 13 in the 80s, 12 in the 90s and five in the 100s. There were eight net scores in the 60s, 29 in the 70s and three in the 80s. All in all, we all had a pretty good day, with the vast majority shooting in the net 70s. Good job!

Overall, our players had 18 birdies, with Donnie Bradham having the most with five. We had 238 pars, with Louis Menchaca, Bob Mason and Jeff Dehart having the most with 12 each. And we had 54 "others," with Josh Howard carding the most with 8. But the rest of his round must have been pretty good, since he won \$60 along the way!
